With Care Solace, families and staff gain access to a dedicated Care Concierge team, with experts available around-the-clock to guide users through processes related to insurance, provider availability, wait times and scheduling. Care Solace's care navigation system uses proprietary technology and a vast database of behavioral and mental healthcare resources to find carefully vetted therapists and programs in minutes.

"MSA-7 is a small, community school that feels like a family. Just like family, we're here for eachother during times of need and challenge," said Meagan Wittek, Principal of

Magnolia Science Academy - 7. "Care Solace is just one more way that we can be here for our community members -by connecting them with the support and resources they need to get through those challenging times."

More than 90,000 school staff and parents at partnering school communities of Care Solace used the pre-screening tool, with at least 40,000 students receiving mental healthcare support as a result. Care Solace has facilitated an estimated total of 4,500 crisis interventions.
